












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What does innovation mean to me?

Can it make a difference to adult social care?

Definition of Innovation (TLAP jargon buster):

Doing something in a new way, with the aim of doing it better.

Definition of Co-production (TLAP jargon buster):

When you as an individual are involved as an equal partner in designing the support and services you receive. Co-production recognises that people who use social care services (and their families) have knowledge and experience that can be used to help make services better, not only for themselves but for other people who need social care.



Future of Innovation in adult social care

- Care Innovation Challenge, interesting innovation such as the Al Robo Chat that reduces loneliness.
- Innovation in social care is behind, and often not considered an innovation in the wider world.
 - Lots to learn from other sectors that are further ahead.
 - Examples: Self-driving cars Balancing safety & risk vs real life benefits
- Drivers for innovation are often cost cutting, will these innovations increase isolation?
- Working with people with lived experience, fostering connections, relationships and working in co-production are all key.
